New Clinical System

To improve interoperability with other health care providers which will help us give our patients more efficient and joined up care The White House Surgery is changing clinical computer systems.

This is a major undertaking meaning we will have around 5 days without a fully functioning computer system . There will then be a period of learning the new system which may impact processing times

If your repeat medication is due anytime in June please ensure you put your repeat request in by Friday the 31st May to reduce the likelihood of a delay in you receiving your prescription.

There will be a period of time from the 11.6.19 to 20.6.19 when we will be running a reduced service.

Foreign Travel -Please discuss this with your travel agent or ticket seller if vaccinations are required. Further advice can be gained from <u>www.fitfortravel.nhs.uk</u>.

When booking in for travel vaccines hand in a completed travel questionnaire available from Reception allowing 6-8 weeks before date of travel. please ensure you have your requirements in writing and bring with you to your appointment. **Rabies, yellow fever, Japanese Encephalitis and oral cholera vaccine are not available at this surgery.**

Sun Safety

While we enjoy the hot weather it is important to remember that extreme heat can damage your health.

Some tips to help you stay well: -

- Avoid going out in the hottest part of the day 11.00am. to 3.00pm.
- Avoid strenuous activity
- Stay in the shade
- Wear a hat, sunglasses and cover up clothing especially important for children
- Drink regularly, avoiding tea/coffee/alcohol
- Remember to wear sun cream with a high sun protection factor.

Signs of heat exhaustion/heatstroke are headaches, dizziness, nausea, vomiting, muscle cramps, sleepiness, confusion, convulsions and loss of consciousness.

Hay Fever

The pollen count has been very high recently and more and more people seem to be suffering with the symptoms. Your pharmacist will be able to advise you what products are available to buy to treat the symptoms without having to see the doctor- such as antihistamines, eye drops or nasal sprays. If however the symptoms persist you are then advised to contact the surgery for advice.
